In addition to the figures and interventions reported in this Situation Report (SITREP), Amel Association International (Amel) continues to ensure the continuity of its livelihood, protection, health, food security, and education activities whenever and wherever possible. CONTEXT

At the end of the month, the situation remains extremely tense, with ongoing Israeli attacks targeting cities and villages across Lebanon. Since the conflict began, 178 paramedics have lost their lives, 279 have been injured, and 246 emergency vehicles have been targeted. The vulnerability of healthcare workers and facilities has become increasingly pronounced. There have been 55 documented attacks on healthcare facilities, with 36 hospitals directly targeted. These attacks have led to the forced closure of eight hospitals, with an additional seven operating at reduced capacity.

On October 30, three airstrikes struck Saida, resulting in 15 fatalities and 56 injuries. At the same time, the entire city of Baalbek was placed under an evacuation order, causing another wave of mass displacement, while Nabatiyeh also came under heavy bombardment. The following day, October 31, Israeli forces targeted civil defense and rescue workers in Tyre. For the first time since the start of the conflict, the Israeli military issued an evacuation order on October 31 for a Palestinian refugee camp, along with ten villages in southern Lebanon. Meanwhile, airstrikes continued in Beirut's southern suburbs, with a significant strike on Saturday afternoon in the Hazmieh area, and a vehicle targeted in Dahret El-Wahech, Mount Lebanon. Lebanon's Ministry of Public Health reports that, since October 8, 2023, the violence has led to 2,867 fatalities, including 178 children and 560 women, and has left over 13,000 injured. The displacement crisis remains severe, with 1.2 million people forced to leave their homes. Of these, 191,692 are now staying in 1,130 collective shelters, 948 of which have reached full capacity. Public spaces like the Corniche and Martyrs' Square in Beirut are crowded with displaced individuals, many of whom are facing increasingly difficult conditions following the season's first rains on Saturday, November 2.

Amidst this crisis, Amel remains committed to its humanitarian response, focusing on delivering basic assistance, primary health services, and protection support to those affected by the conflict, including internally displaced persons. In parallel, Amel emphasizes a coordinated and complementary response, collaborating with other partners through relevant government and United Nations-led structures.

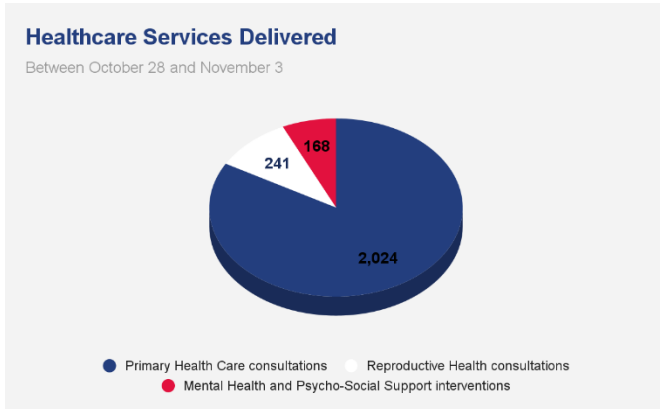

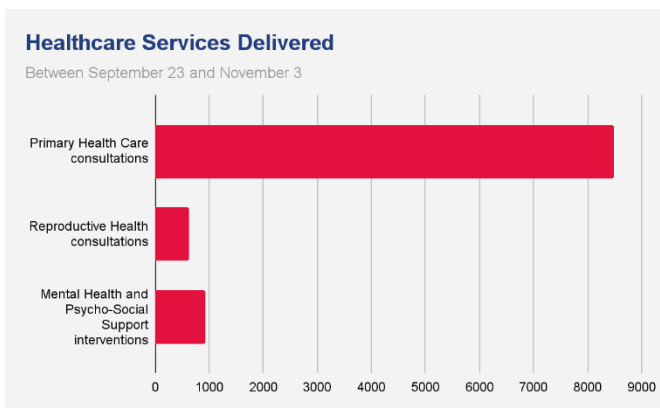


❖ Health Interventions through Mobile Modalities

Number of Medical consultations:



To ensure continuity of care during the crisis, between October 28 and November 3, **2024** Primary Health Care consultations, **241** Reproductive Health consultations, and **168** Mental Health and Psycho-Social Support interventions were provided in Beirut, Bekaa, and South areas



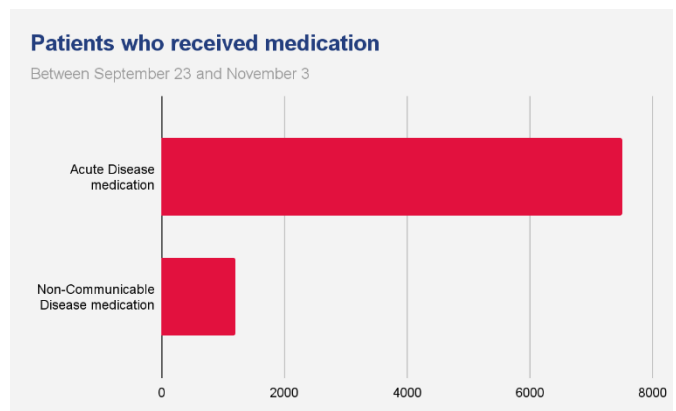
Since September 23, **8 494** Primary Health Care consultations, **622** Reproductive Health consultations, and **924** Mental Health and Psycho-Social Support interventions have been provided as part of Amel's Emergency Response.

Provision of Medication and Assistive Devices:

Between October 28 and November 3, **2 841** acute medications and **302** non-communicable medications were distributed.

Out of these, **1 832** patients received Acute Disease medication while **135** received Non-Communicable Disease medication.

In total, since September 23, **7 510** patients received acute disease medication and **1 196** received non-communicable disease medication.



Between October 28 and November 3, **4** children were vaccinated, for a total of **102** children vaccinated since September 23rd.

During the same period, **13** patients have been referred to hospitals, for a total of **27** referred patients since September 23. Plus, **4** patients were referred to hospital for delivery, bringing the total of referrals for delivery since September 23rd to **4**.

In addition, between October 28 and November 3, **1** assistive device was distributed, for a total of **29** assistive devices distributed since September 23.

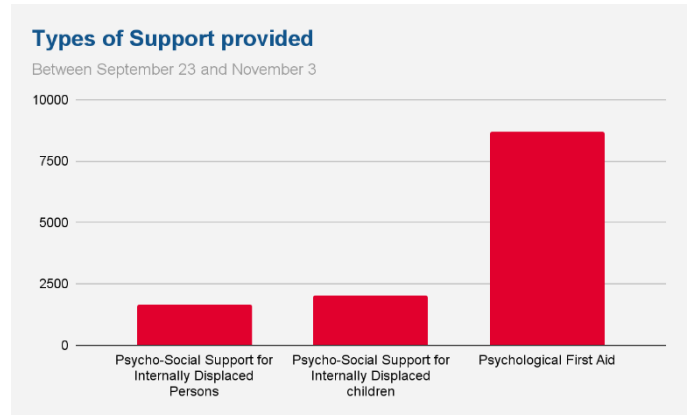
❖ Protection Interventions

Psychological First Aid:

Between October 28 and November 3, a total of **850** Internally Displaced Persons received Psychological First Aid, bringing the total of Internally Displaced Persons who received Psychological First Aid since September 23 to **8 697**.

Psycho-Social Support:

Between Monday, October 28 and Sunday, November 3, a total of **186** Internally Displaced children received Psycho-Social Support, bringing the total of Internally Displaced children who received Psycho-Social Support to **2 058** since September 23.



Mental Health Support:

Between October 28 and November 3, **38** Internally Displaced Persons received Mental Health Support, for a total of **175** Internally Displaced Persons who benefited from Mental Support since September 23.

Between Monday, October 28 and Sunday, November 3, **6** Internally Displaced Person received Gender-Based Violence counseling, for a total of **28** Internally Displaced Person who received Gender-Based Violence counseling since the launch of Amel's Emergency Response.

In addition, **9** Internally Displaced Persons benefited from a Social follow-up and **4** Internally Displaced Persons benefited from case management activities.

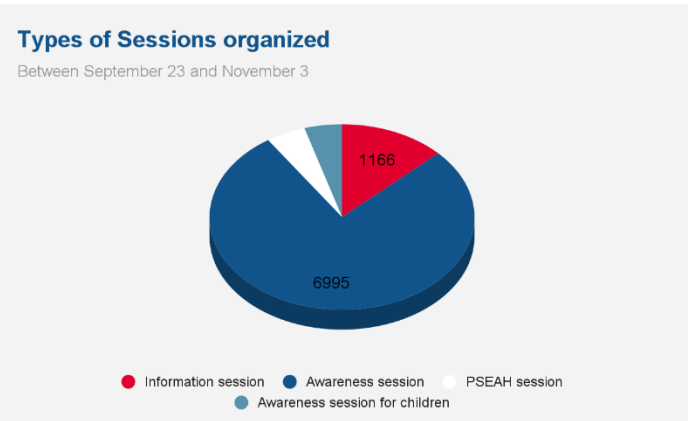
Emotional Support Group:

Between October 28 and November 3, **7** Internally Displaced Persons participated in an Emotional Support group, for a total of **18** Internally Displaced Persons participating in Emotional Support groups.

Sessions:

Between October 28 and November 3, **1 290** Internally Displaced Persons participated in information and awareness sessions. This brings the total of Internally Displaced Persons engaged in these two types of session since September 23 to **8 161**. Among these, **1 166** Internally Displaced Persons attended information sessions, including **239** who participated in information sessions between October 28 and November 3.

Additionally, **1 051** Internally Displaced Persons took part in awareness sessions between October 28 and November 3, for a total of **6 995** Internally Displaced Persons who have participated in awareness sessions since September 23.

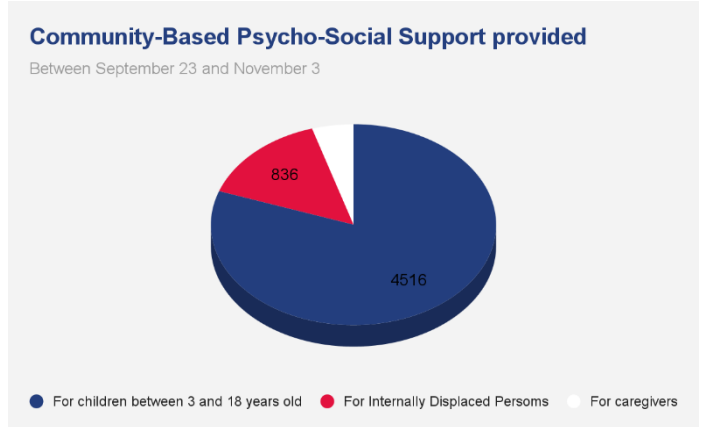




Community-Based Psycho-Social Support:

Between October 28 and November 3, **70** Internally Displaced Caregivers received Community-Based Psycho-Social Support, for a total of **264** Internally Displaced Caregivers since September 23.

Additionally, **85** Internally Displaced Persons received Community-Based Psycho-Social Support, bringing the total of Internally Displaced Persons who received Community-Based Psycho-Social Support since September 23 to **836**.



Finally, **1 201** Internally Displaced children between 3 and 18 years old received Community-Based Psycho-Social Support, for a total of **4 516** Internally Displaced children since September 23.

Sport for Development:

Between October 28 and November 3, **42** Internally Displaced children between 10 and 18 years old took part in Sport for Development activities, for a total of **201** Internally Displaced children participants since September 23.

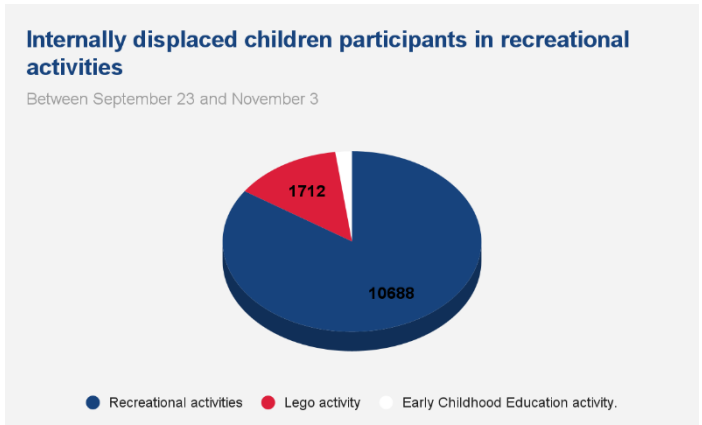
Referrals and Inclusion assessment:

Between Monday, October 28 and Sunday, November 3, **4** referrals for health services were made, for a total of **208** referrals since the start of the escalation and the implementation of Amel's Emergency Response on September 23. In addition,

Plus, **7** cases were identified during Inclusion assessments, for a total of **249** identified cases since September 23.

Recreational activities:

Between October 28 and November 3, **2 137** Internally Displaced children took part in recreational activities, bringing the total of Internally Displaced children participants in recreational activities to **10 688** since September 23.

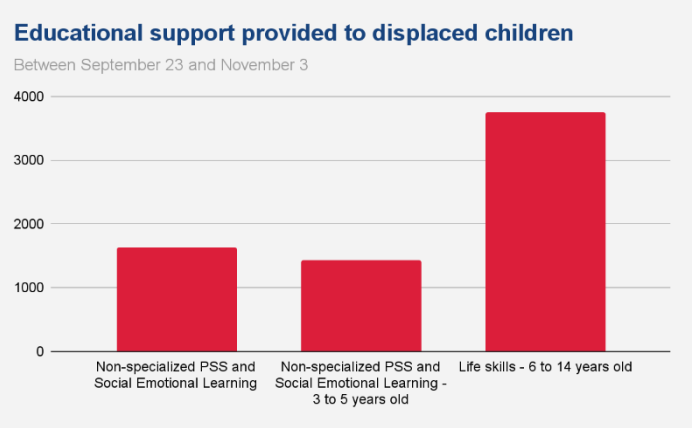


❖ Education

Between Monday, October 28 and Sunday, November 3, **30** Psycho-Social Support (PSS), Social Emotional Learning (SEL), recreational or learning sessions were organized for a total of **236** Internally Displaced children supported. Which brings the total of Internally Displaced children supported with non-specialized PSS and SEL activities, since September 23 to **1627**, for a total of **185** PSS, SEL, recreational or learning sessions organized.

In addition, Monday, October 28 and Sunday, November 3, **389** Internally Displaced children between 3 and 5 years old were also supported with non-specialized PSS and Social Emotional Learning activities, for a total of **1430** children between 3 and 5 years old supported.

During the same period, **986** Internally Displaced children between 6 and 14 years old were supported with Life skills activities, for a total of **3751** supported children since September 23.



Finally, **29** Internally Displaced Persons / Affected parents/caregivers were engaged in sessions related to learning continuity and well-being during a crisis, for a total of **106** Internally Displaced Persons / affected parents / caregivers since September 23.
